The successful applicant will contribute to internationally competitive research on uncovering neural subpopulations and transcriptional networks underlying stress resilience. The groups employ high-throughput genomics assays in combination with neurobiology including behavioural assays. The resulting datasets are analysed using computational and systems biology approaches to generate comprehensive models of gene regulatory program underlying stress response.
